White Owl Campground

Fee: \$6.00/per night

Open: July thru Sept.

Access:

- Travel for 13 miles west of Eagle on I-70 to the Dotsero exit and follow the signs for Sweetwater/ Burns by turning north, right, onto the Colorado River Rd.
- Stay on this road for 1.8 miles and turn left at Coffee Pot Springs Rd., FDR 600.
- Travel for 26 1/4 miles and turn left at the sign for White Owl Lake, FDR 614.

Facilities:

- Three of the sites are to the right of the vault in the open meadow, these sites are good for vehicles with trailers or RV's under 30 feet long.
- The other eight sites are partially shaded and accessible by a road to the left of the toilet.
- All the sites are equipped with picnic tables and fire ring grills.

Natural Features:

- White Owl Campground is located on 21 acre White Owl Lake at 10,680 feet elevation.
- The surrounding landscape is small hills and typical subalpine meadows with sparse stands of spruce/ fir forest.

Attractions:

- **Fishing**— Due to winter kill, White Owl Lake has no fish. Deep lake and Heart Lake, a short distance farther up the Coffee Pot Road provide good fishing opportunities.
- **4-Wheel Drive Roads**— There are a number of 4-wheel drive roads for use by jeeps, ATV's and motorcycles around the Heart Lake and Deep Lake area, but please stay on the designated roads. The subalpine meadows are fragile and do not recover quickly from off-road use.
